







SOLAR LIGHT DISTRIBUTION PROGRAM

The 'Watts On Lighting Students Lives' program was inspired by the safety, security and educational empowerment that Light brings.

- Since 2019 solar lights distributed to students with a focus on those preparing for national exams.
- Students in Kenya take the same level of exams whether they have access to electricity or not. Resulting scores determine the level and quality of high school students can attend.
- With support from the county education department, school principals and our local team, we distribute the lights, including a training session involving Parents and Teachers.
- Data is collected to follow up and monitor overall impact.

- Improved educational performance and attendance

SAFETY AND SECURITY

The solar lights also protect women and children from 'raiders' who assault them in the night and steal livestock. When a solar light is hung outside the homestead, the raiders not wanting to be identified, do not enter.


























Film Festival and Film Screening Events


